If you have an insurance policy for your autos, boats, jewelry, home, etc., you are assessed a 5% tax on all premiums. This tax should be remitted to the City of Hurstbourne. But in many instances it is sent to Jefferson County Metro Government.

**Our grounds are beautifully landscaped, and exceptionally well maintained.**

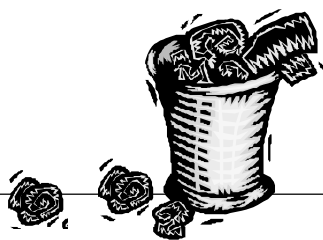
**We maintain a waiting list, and we take applications on Wednesdays between 9:00am and 11:00am. At the present time our waiting list is running about a year.**

### **LATEX PAINT DISPOSAL**

Remove the lid. Set can in a well-ventilated area until paint is dried. Set it out for collection next to your trash with the lid off. You may place kitty litter in the paint to help it dry faster.

### **OIL-BASED PAINT DISPOSAL**

Oil-based paint is considered household hazardous waste. You may take oil-based paint and other qualifying items to the HazBin.

### **HAZBIN**

The HazBin is located at 7501 Grade Lane about one quarter mile from the Outer Loop. It is open Wednesdays and Saturdays from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. For more information about HazBin please call 574-7336.

### **REFRIGERATORS**

Please have the freon from a refrigerator removed by a registered technician before you put it out for junk pick-up. Leave the technician's official sticker on the refrigerator for pick-up.

## **Sanitation Holiday Pick-up Schedule for the Remainder of 2003**

**THANKSGIVING DAY, THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 27, 2003.** Rumpke will provide regularly scheduled services on Tuesday, November 25. They will not be collecting our city's garbage on Friday, November 28; therefore, they will pick-up sanitation on Saturday, November 29, 2003.

**CHRISTMAS DAY, THURSDAY, DECEMBER 25, 2003.** Rumpke will provide regularly scheduled services on Tuesday, December 23. They will not be collecting our city's garbage on Friday, December 26; therefore, they will pick-up sanitation on Saturday, December 27, 2003.

**CHRISTMAS TREE REMOVAL.** Christmas trees will be removed on regular yard waste day pick-up, which is on Friday. Please place your Christmas tree at the curb with all decorations removed. Rumpke will not take trees that still have any decorative trimmings on them. A Christmas tree may be put out whole - it is not necessary to cut it in half for removal.

# *Halloween Safety*

Halloween is Friday, October 31, 2003. Please leave your porch light on if you wish to give children a treat. This lets parents know it is all right for the children to approach your house. Also, drive slowly through the neighborhood that night to protect children and parents who are out trick-or-treating.

## HERE ARE SOME HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS TO MAKE SURE IT IS A SAFE HOLIDAY FOR CHILDREN, PARENTS AND HOMEOWNERS:

- Carry a flashlight
  - Stay on sidewalks
  - Avoid wearing masks while walking from house to house
  - Ideally, children of all ages should be accompanied by an adult
  - Battery powered jack o'lantern candles are preferable to a real flame
  - Pets get frightened on Halloween. Put them up to protect them from cars or inadvertently biting a trick-or-treater
  - Walk, don't run
  - Don't cut across yards or driveways
  - Approach only houses that are lit
  - Stay away from and don't pet animals you don't know
  - If you buy a costume, look for one made of flame-retardant material
  - Make sure your yard is clear of such things as ladders, hoses, dog leashes and flower pots that people might trip over
