STOP SIGNS – NOT A BILLBOARD



On many occasions, pets are lost or found by residents. Unfortunately, a popular method of getting the word out is taping pictures of the pet and contact information to City Stop Signs. Please don't use Stop Signs as a public billboard as there are rules against this practice. Most importantly, tape and the like are damaging to the reflective materials of the Stop Signs.

HOUSE NUMBERS



If you stand back from your home and your house numbers look similar to the picture on the right, or you can't see them very well, it might be time for an upgrade. Guidelines used for proper display of address numbers are listed below.

All residential properties must conspicuously display appropriate street addresses to be in compliance with applicable ordinances and fire service requirements.

- House numbers must be placed on the front of the residence in a location clearly visible to vehicles traveling in either direction on the nearest fronting road.
- Standard Arabic numerals shall not be written out.
- Numerals must be in a color clearly distinguishable from the background.
- Numerals should be at least four inches in height.
- Numbers which are painted on the street curbing or road do not comply with these requirements.

DOG WASTE



Many dog owners out for a walk leave unwelcomed gifts in the form of waste.

Pet Owners – Please be a good neighbor and attend to your pet.

Dog walkers – please remove pet waste and place the waste in *your bag and your garbage*.

TREES IN HURSTBOURNE



Each year the City contracts with experts to inventory and evaluate all of the more than 1,100 trees planted on City property in Hurstbourne. If a tree is dying, diseased or presents a hazard it is marked for removal. Upon review of recommendations by the Horticulturist, the Commission authorizes the plan.

This year a total of 38 trees have been removed along with the roots and chips. The soil and cover will be replenished at each location. It is customary for the City to replace trees in equal or greater number to the removals. The City strongly supports a healthy tree canopy.

LINN STATION ENTRANCE UPDATE



All construction, lighting, irrigation, signage and fences are complete. A landscaping plan has been accepted and authorized. The landscaping is expected to be completed by the end of March or early April. The fencing will be painted black after the wood has seasoned.

CITY OF HURSTBOURNE ORDINANCE 17-02 AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO REVISIONS TO CODIFIED CHAPTER 111

Ordinance 17-02 amends the City's Codified Ordinances, Chapter 111, regulating the sale of alcoholic beverages. This ordinance changes the Sunday hours that alcoholic beverages can be sold to match those hours currently in place in the City of Louisville. This change has been made to promote consistency and avoid confusion for license holders and the public. This ordinance was passed on March 14th, 2017. MAKE YOUR RECYCLING COUNT

Recycling in Hurstbourne has never been easier, and it's important to remember what items should and should not go in your recycling container. Rumpke accepts a wide range of materials for recycling, but there are certain items that should never be placed in the recycling.

So what are some of these items? What items are acceptable for recycling? What items are not?

YES! - Recycle This:

- Cardboard boxes (flattened)
- Paper
- Newspaper including inserts
- Junk mail
- Plastic bottles and jugs
- Aluminum cans
- Steel cans
- Glass bottles and jars
- Clean pizza boxes
- Cartons (juice boxes and cartons for broth, milk, wine)

NO! - Not for Recycling:

- Plastic bags
- Hazardous material (e.g. batteries, propane tanks, lighters)
- Tangles (garden hoses, clothing, bed sheets, cords, chains, leashes and VHS tapes)
- Needles and sharps (medical syringes, needles, etc.)
- Scrap metal
- Foil
- Plastic toys
- Whipped topping or butter tubs
- Packing peanuts and bubble wrap
- Ceramics
- Aluminum pie pans and roasting pans

A successful recycling program takes a partnership between our city residents and Rumpke. By placing the right items in the recycling (and keeping the wrong items out), we make our recycling count.
