PAVING PROJECT FOR 2020

Every year City Streets are resurfaced based on several factors including age, traffic use, and graded condition. Sections of the following streets are scheduled to be paved:

- Albemarle Court (1994)
- Bedfordshire Road, Court, Huddersfield Court and Cheshire Way (1993)
- Leighton Circle (1989)
- Wimborne Way, Liverton Lane / Arundel Way (1990)
- Williamsburg Plaza (2002)
- Leesgate Road (2002)



ONGOING DRAINAGE PROJECTS IN YOUR CITY

The latest phase of ongoing drainage projects is located on Blairwood Road. The old retention basin located in front of Days Inn was overgrown for decades. Now water can collect and flow freely as part of the annual city-wide storm water clearing and mitigation plan. Each year, the City sets aside funds for large storm water drainage systems, storm grates and major creek clearing. The latest section of creek clearing is located near the 700 block of Nottingham Parkway across along Cadogan Court to Rugby.

GOLF CARTS – CITY OF HURSTBOURNE



In a recent City of Hurstbourne Commission meeting, residents requested the Commission to adopt the Ordinance to allow golf carts to operate on the City streets within Hurstbourne. Ordinance 20-06 was subsequently approved by the City of Hurstbourne Commission.

Procedures are being developed and will be available on our City's website within the next few weeks.

5G & FIBER OPTIC UPGRADES IN THE CITY

AT&T is currently upgrading facilities through the City of Hurstbourne including fiberoptic extensions to improve existing Cable & Internet services. You may have seen the "stitch boring machine" setup in the right-of-way along one of the major roadways, and crews working their way down one side of the road. These boring machines are installing plastic piping to allow improved fiber optics to be "pulled" through and connected throughout the City. These crews are working in right-of-way and AT&T easements with a goal of getting in and out with as little disturbance as possible. Please bear with us as we improve our City infrastructure network to bring faster internet and cable services to those who need it. In addition, Phase 1 of the 5G infrastructure upgrades will be taking place at five locations in the City and should be completed by the end of this year. These additional "small cell" poles will allow 5G networks to talk to each other and pave the way for all of our future devices to be connected on the "Internet of Things (IOT)". Refrigerators that order groceries, appliances that tell you when there is a problem, smart homes (HVAC and lighting), and self-driving cars that talk to each other, are just some examples of what life will be like in the near future!

City of Hurstbourne 2020 Taxes

Just a friendly reminder about your City of Hurstbourne tax bill for 2020. Tax bills were mailed to the address on record July 1. Many payments have been received and posted. The bills are due November 30, 2020. After that date, penalties will be imposed as noted on the bill. Please be aware there will not be subsequent invoices generated.

NOVEMBER VOTING INFORMATION

Kentucky voters will have three ways to cast their ballots for this November’s elections.

- 1) Absentee ballot - From now until October 9, those who are concerned about contacting or spreading COVID-19 may request an absentee ballot Govoteky.com These ballots are required to be postmarked by November 3 (Election Day). For those concerned about postal delays, county clerks are required to provide secure drop boxes for the return of absentee ballots.
- 2) In-person voting prior to Election Day - Beginning October 13, in-person voting will be an option. This will be available during regular business hours and at least four hours on the three Saturdays before November 3. Locations will be announced later.
- 3) Election Day voting - There will be a limited number of polling places available on Election Day, though the exact number and location are not yet known. The Jefferson County Clerk is looking for citizens to fill positions as election officers on November 3.
